Print Image Rules and Guidelines for LCCC Competitions

(Applies to all CACCA Competitions)

The Image

- Any Image is eligible.
 - Remember YOU are the photographic artist ... as long as it is in good taste.
- Image must be created and edited by the maker
 - No clip art or downloaded content not created by the maker
- Image may be Color or Monochrome (Black OR White with a SINGLE color)
 - Duotone / Tritone etc. images MUST be entered as a color image

- Image must fit on an 11 x 14 or 16 x 20 mat board
 - Size of mat board is strictly limited to 11 x 14 or 16 x 20 inches. NO OTHER SIZES or SHAPES of mat ARE PERMITTED



Image may be any shape as long as it fits on the board

- Image may be printed by maker or commercial printer
 - Alterations or editing by a 2nd party is not allowed

- Any print media is allowed
 - Glossy, matte, fiber (canvas, silk,natural), metallic surface etc.
- Makers choice for mounting
 - Must be securely mounted to board with glue, hot press mounted, double sided tapes etc.
 - Double matting is permitted if printed image is secure.
 <u>Insecurely mounted images will be disqualified and returned to maker</u>
 - Images will be handled multiple times and cannot be protected from some potential damage

- Borders are optional
 - May be added to printed image at the makers discretion
 - Color, size, shape of border is maker's choice
 - See the various Resizing and Putting Borders on Print Images tutorials for how to do it
 - If border is present, it should not distract or compete with the image

 Border may be added after mounting or printed as part of the image as long as it is securely fixed to the presentation.

The Mat Board

- Mat boards are available from the Club Competition Chairman at Club meetings
- Mat boards may be purchased from art supply stores as long as they conform to the exact 11 x 14 and 16 x 20 size limitations
- Mats do NOT have to be Black / White although most competition images are submitted on Black boards
- Double matting is permitted if the printed image is secure (but is usually not done)
